

Technology Rules

- All technology is a privilege, not a right.

TV

- TV on weekends and holidays only. (No TV on school nights)
- 1-2 hours total TV on non-school days.
- Shows need to be approved by Dad and Mom and any show can be turned off if it is inappropriate.
- Dad and Mom have final say on TV time, movies, etc.
- There maybe times of TV "Fasts" where the whole house will not watch TV.

Phone

- All phone conversations and texting can and will be seen by Dad and Mom (keep all texts or other information for Dad and Mom who will allow you to delete them).
- Are not to be used in bedrooms unless permission is granted by Dad and Mom and only for one call. Phone comes back out of room immediately after the call.
- All phones are to be in the recharging station when at home unless permission is given to use the phone.
- A phone can be taken away at any time by Dad and Mom.

iPods/Pads or Tablets

- Are to be used only in visible areas of the house (never to be used in bedrooms).
- Are not to be connected to the internet unless permission from Dad and Mom and only for one task at a time (download a game or update).
- On school nights only 1/2 hour of play time. On non-school days only 1 hour unless an agreement is made with Dad or Mom for more time. A timer is to be used!
- Dad and Mom can see the device any time and have final say on the games that can be used.

Computers

- Keep personal information private online, including on social media such as Facebook.
- Only chat or friend people online who you know in real life. Tell mom or dad if someone seeks to communicate with you in an inappropriate way.
- Dad and Mom can monitor and require approval for any social media, online purchases, and purchases for internet or communication uses.
- Be Smart! Always be aware of what is going on around you online and who you are interacting with. THIS IS NOT A GAME!

My Family Purity Pledge
